From the Pastor's Pen

Conflict. Our word "conflict" comes from the Latin and it means two things: to strike against, or to create a contest between. And that contest? No, that's not a spelling bee. It refers to a gladiator battle to the death. When a conflict arises, there are several different kinds of responses. Some try to ignore it. Others hit it head on. Others look for ways to avoid it or placate it. Others run and hide. A professor of mine once said, "I've met very few people that liked conflict, and once I met them I wished I hadn't." Let's face it. The majority of us don't like it.

And part of the reason we don't like conflict is that we see it as the opposite of being at peace. Where there is conflict, there is strife. Where there is conflict, someone is going to get hurt. Feeling content or even just feeling at ease is not an option when there is conflict. And this is why there are so many people who are upset, frustrated, angry, scared, and/or saddened with what is going on in our world. There is conflict everywhere. At every level of government, there is conflict. As I write this, there is one of the largest mainstream church denominations in the world in the midst of a conflict which will likely rip it apart. And no individual church that's been around for more than a week is a stranger to conflict either. It's everywhere. And some have come to the conclusion that it's just getting worse and worse and worse. Where there is conflict, there is no possibility of peace.

.....or is there?

What if that isn't true? What if peace can be "normal" even in the midst of conflict and turmoil? What if peace and joy have nothing to do with the circumstances that surround us?

Starting in February, we are going to dive into one of Paul's letters that he wrote to the church in Philippi. And believe me, this church was filled with conflict. Their founder, Paul, was in prison. People all over the place were trash-talking him and making fun of any church he started. Rome is becoming less and less friendly towards Christians as the Jews are stirring the pot saying that Christians are a secret society build upon cannibalism (eating Jesus flesh and drinking his blood). Just so you know, both secret societies and cannibalism were against Roman Law. And to top off all of that, there were two women leaders in the church who were going at each other every chance they got, making even worship services uncomfortable. If there's a church in the New Testament that understood what conflict was, this one would be it.

In this letter, Paul not only tells them to get their act together and get along, he also gives them some key spiritual strategies to live in peace even when there is conflict. He directs them along a path that avoids worry and leads to joy. He helps them focus upon what really matters and put aside the things that only look like they matter. And this is what we are going to dive deep into during the month of February in our worship services together.

Got conflict that's getting under your skin? Unresolved things keep you awake at night? That's not God's plan for you. Let's see together what God has to say and be transformational, not just to the person in the mirror, but to those around us caught up in the conflicts.
