

I had someone ask me not too long ago why I'm a Baptist. The October business meeting we had last month was one of the reasons why I am a Baptist. It wasn't the food, although those were some pretty amazing soups. It wasn't the desserts, although again, wow! It was how we live out our core beliefs and in the end how we glorify God. I could not be more proud nor could I be more pleased than to be here right now.

We held a vote on whether or not to form a search committee for a full-time associate pastor. There were great questions—real questions. They were asked from the heart and it was clear that the goal was to

understand and not try to trap someone with their words. It was a family meeting, for sure. Then the vote was held, and the vote ended up 77% in favor and 23% not in favor. But what happened next was what brought a tear to my eye and a lump in my throat. The deacons apparently had a little mini-meeting in the kitchen after counting the votes. Although the vote showed a majority in favor, the Deacons recognized that there were voices in our family that had concerns and they set out to address those concerns. Everyone's voice mattered.

How absolutely different than what I see in the political realms. If one side wins by one vote in the political arenas, then its over—the winners laugh and try to force those who had reservations into submission. It's a "win-lose" scenario where the winner gets all the spoils and the loser...well loses. What the Deacons did was very much opposite of that. Concerns are heard, not discounted, even when the concerned number in the minority.

This is SO BIBLICAL! Remember when Moses sent the spies into the Promised Land? Ten of the spies came back saying, "God is clearly not in this and if He is, He's not big enough to handle this." Two said, "God said we should go, let's go!" Who got it right? It wasn't the 83% majority that got it right. Oh, how things would have been different if the 17% were heard!

One of the core values of being Baptist is that we believe in the priesthood of all saints. That means that everyone who is saved has the same amount of the Holy Spirit as the rest of the saved. We hold as a core value the autonomy of the local church. That means we don't look to denominations, regional officials, or others when we need to make decisions. We don't even look at the Pastor and say, "Tell us what to do," like he's some kind of Pope. God works through all those that make up the local church for local church affairs. That exactly what we set out to do and to honor. And I believe God was honored greatly that afternoon. If people prayed about this before voting, and I have no reason to believe you all didn't, then that vote was exactly what the Holy Spirit wanted. And there is a message in the vote. When there are concerns enough to vote no, then there is a missing piece or pieces to the puzzle. Although we don't exactly know what those missing puzzle pieces are, the Deacons recognized that there are missing pieces and have come up with a strategy to begin to discern what they are. No one was condemned for their conviction in the vote. No one was brushed aside. There will be no railroading, bullying nor "neener—neener—neenering." The Holy Spirit wasn't grieved. This is God's will on earth as it is in Heaven—or at least as close as it can get this side of Heaven!

I think one of those puzzle pieces was that I didn't communicate clearly at times. Some walked away thinking that I was disappointed in Pastor Allen, Emily and Dr. Hannah's work with the youth. That couldn't be further from the truth. They are extremely hard workers and are doing all that they can to reach the youth of our community. My point was that youth are harder to reach even in the last year. I am so proud to have them on our team. They simply cannot be replaced. And I want to make that clear. I apologize for that miscommunication. There is no plan or hope to replace our youth team with a full-time associate pastor. The request to consider a full-time associate pastor has nothing to do with them or Pastor John's hard work or Pastor Evan's hard work. We are all exceeding capacity. Initially, we may have brought these three wonderful men on board to help me. What happened is that they all found areas where nothing was being done or things were going to go undone and filled those gaps. Ministry increased powerfully but there was little relief. The workers are few and the harvest is great. There are large gaps in opportunities in our community that we still need to address. The question for us now is "how best do we address those needs?"

Do we bring on more staff or do we look at those in the pews and raise volunteering expectations there? Or both? I don't know that that was adequately and succinctly stated, either. My apologies.

The only way we are going to find out what lies ahead in God's will is to pray about it. The Deacons will continue to work through the "missing pieces" issue until there is peace—not just on the Deacon Board but in our family as a whole as well. And when that happens, watch out, Lamar! You have no idea what a unified church focused upon ministering to you with the power and love of God is going to accomplish in your midst.

The Holy Spirit inspired Paul to write to the church in Philippi the following words. As you read them, understand that we are in the midst of accomplishing just this:

"So if there is any encouragement in Christ any comfort from love any participation in the Spirit, any affection and sympathy, complete my joy by being of the same minds having the same love being in full accord and of one mind."


